
Suffolk Conservatives have frozen the county council's share of basic council tax since 2010. You will be paying the same this year as you have over the previous seven years.

Suffolk Conservatives are committed to running a low-tax county council. We maintain services by being more effective and efficient rather than by asking you to pay more. We pledge that in future years, Council Tax will only be increased by the barest minimum necessary to enable us to balance the books and continue to provide good levels of services for Suffolk's residents.

ROADS

Over the past year, we renewed more than 300 miles of roads across Suffolk at a cost of £10 million and we are already working on upgrading more of the county's road network this summer.

Suffolk's Conservatives undertake to repair 1,000 miles of roads - a quarter of the county's network - over the next four years. We are setting up specialist teams to focus on areas such as drainage so we can bring our roads up to a good standard more efficiently. When problems occur we will fix them quickly. Already 96% of urgent faults are repaired within five working days.



Caring for Suffolk's elderly and vulnerable residents is one of our top priorities.

VULNERABLE PEOPLE

We recognise that Suffolk has an ageing population and we aim to support our elderly residents to live active and fulfilling lives. We will enable people, who want to stay in their homes, to do so and live independently for as long as possible. We have facilitated a £60m programme to develop ten modern, well equipped care homes across the county. Over the next four years, we will invest £1billion on caring for Suffolk's elderly residents.

EDUCATION AND CHILDREN'S SERVICES

Nearly 90% of Suffolk schools are rated by OFSTED as 'Outstanding' or 'Good'. We are committed to increasing this figure to 100%.

Suffolk is now ranked in the top half of all authorities for progress at GCSE. We will work closely with parents, teachers and school leaders to raise standards further. We will equip our young people to get highly skilled jobs. We supported the University of Suffolk's bid for independent status. We will extend across the county our innovative MyGo youth employment centres which have already helped thousands of young people into work.

We are dedicated to safeguarding and protecting vulnerable children and young people. We have invested heavily to develop one of the best children's services teams in the country. Suffolk County Council has won national recognition for its work with children in care or at-risk.



HEALTH AND WELLBEING

Our aim is to ensure that Suffolk's residents live long, healthy and fulfilling lives.

We are planning and investing to meet the changing needs of people across Suffolk. It should not matter who you are or where you live when it comes to your health and your opportunities in life. We are working with the NHS Mental Health Trusts and other services to help and support the most fragile. We will work to encourage residents to lead healthier and more active lives, for example by continuing to develop new cycle networks and by supporting projects to help people to give up smoking.

Suffolk Conservatives have helped to establish sporting events across the county, which have inspired thousands of people, including "Park Runs" almost 150 walks, the Women's Tour of Britain and the inaugural Great East

TRAVEL AND TRANSPORT

Our county's economy needs a strong, reliable transport network to enable business to thrive. We will work with Network Rail and train operators in our campaign for the best possible train service for Suffolk's residents. Our continued investment in community transport through our Connecting Communities scheme has extended services in rural areas. It provides people with a reliable community bus service to get them to college, work and hospital.

Working with the police, we will tackle speeding and make our road network safer. We will also develop new cycle networks around key service centres such as schools, surgeries and shops.



INFRASTRUCTURE

We will build a 21st century infrastructure for our county to encourage growth and prosperity.

We plan to provide reliable, modern internet and road networks across the county. We are investing £40m in the Upper Orwell Crossings in Ipswich and Third River Crossing in Lowestoft in addition to £151m Government funding. This will unlock £6.6billion economic regeneration in our county town by easing traffic flow and opening up new development sites. Strategic investment projects in Lowestoft and Bury St Edmunds will relieve traffic congestion and present opportunities for regeneration and development.

ENVIRONMENT

Suffolk's Conservatives are proud of our record of protecting our county's environment.

We have invested in our historic market towns and the re-generation of the Ipswich waterfront. We are conserving Suffolk's scenic countryside. The county's energy-from-waste plant has enabled us to save money on landfill tax, generate electricity and earn income. The plant was built to budget and on time. It takes all Suffolk's domestic waste for incineration and turns it into electricity which powers 30,000 homes. As a result, waste going to landfill in Suffolk has been cut from 44% to just 1%.
